TODAY'S MUSIC ARRANGER

Dr. Ishbah Cox is the Director of Wind Ensembles and Assistant Professor of Music at Capital University in the Conservatory of Music in Columbus, OH. He is a conductor, educator, and arranger with more than twenty years of university and public school experience. Dr. Cox most recently served as the Director of Bands at Olentangy Orange High School in Lewis Center, Ohio. Prior to that appointment, he was an Associate Professor of Bands at Purdue University where he conducted multiple wind bands, brass choir, and he was one of the assistant directors for the marching band. Dr. Cox holds a bachelor's degree in music education from Auburn University, in Auburn, Alabama, his master's degree is in music performance from the University of Alabama, in Tuscaloosa, and a Doctor of Arts in Wind Conducting with a secondary specialization in Euphonium Performance from Ball State University, in Muncie, Indiana. An accomplished arranger for marching and pep bands, Cox currently writes for Hal Leonard Corporation, high schools, and universities throughout the country, including the Purdue University, Penn State University, The Ohio State University, and the University of Wisconsin marching bands. He has also collaborated with global artists Papa Roach and the Huntertones to adapt their music for performances with marching bands.

The Order of Le Regiment de Sambre et Meuse is given to honor an individual who has, through selfless determination, performed works that have demonstrably benefited the public. This action is both unique to the individual, and without doubt could not have occurred, but for them. The award is an homage to the organization's martial history. The tenets of selflessness, courage, generosity, precision, and esprit de corps that create the soul of TBDBITL are exemplified in the music to our most well-known tradition, Script Ohio. Le Regiment de Sambre et Meuse at its heart is an ode to service in the face of adversity.

This year's recipient is Elisabeth Applegate (1995-1997) from Fort Walton Beach, FL. On May 31, 2024, Elisabeth was promoted to Colonel in the US Air Force on the Block "O" of the field at Ohio Stadium. It is worth noting that less than approximately 5% of Lt Col are promoted to Colonel, and approximately 0.1% of Privates make it as far as being promoted to Colonel. As she shared in her speech that afternoon, Elisabeth chose to hold her ceremony in this location because she feels that her time in TBDBITL served as the foundation for her career in the United States Air Force. Colonel Elisabeth Applegate career highlights: Enlisted in Air National Guard Security Forces, later served as Officer at 121st Air Refueling Wing; Served as 71st Intelligence Squadron Flight Commander; Served as Commander of the 655th Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Wing's 28th Intelligence Squadron. This squadron made history for the wing by being led entirely by women under Col Applegate's command. She has deployed seven times, most recently as a Mission Commander flying missions in Africa in harm's way. She has received multiple unit level awards. Served as the Commander of the first squadron to receive a "highly effective" on a unit inspection. Recently attended Joint Command Warfighter School and currently serves as the 7th Air Force Reserve Advisor and JACE (Joint Air Coordination Element) Coordinator, coordinating all reserve exercises. Not only has Elisabeth made history as one of the few female Air Force Colonels, but she is also an outstanding example of a TBDBITL alumni whose record proves she has provided "service in the face of adversity". The OSUMB will be performing in Cleveland at the Browns game on 9/8/2024, on campus in the OSU Homecoming Parade on 10/25/2024, at Mershon Auditorium in Concert on 11/10/24, and in Indianapolis at the Bands of America Grand National Championship on 11/16/2024.

The opening musical theme for the 1994 movie Forrest Gump is sometimes called the Feather Theme. It was composed by Alan Silvestri who scored the movie. It is one of the movie's four major musical themes, each composed to convey a specific emotion. In addition to Silvestri's score, the soundtrack for the movie includes songs from Elvis Presley, Fleetwood Mac, Creedence Clearwater Revival, Aretha Franklin, Three Dog Night, The Mamas & the Papas, The Doobie Brothers, Simon & Garfunkel, Bob Seger, and Buffalo Springfield. The soundtrack reached number-2 on the Billboard album chart, sold twelve-million copies, and is one of the top selling albums in the USA. Alan Silvestri (born in 1950) is an American composer and conductor who works primarily in movies and television. He is best known for his frequent collaboration with movie director Robert Zemeckis, including compositions for movies such as the Back to the Future trilogy and Forrest Gump. He also scored the superhero movies Captain America: The First Avenger and Marvel's The Avengers. He has won two Grammy Awards, three Saturn Awards, and the Max Steiner Film Music Achievement Award.
