### **TODAY'S MUSIC ARRANGER**

Jim Swearingen is starting his 51st year as a member of the arranging staff for The Ohio State University Marching Band. He has earned music education degrees from Bowling Green State University and The Ohio State University. Prior to his appointment at Capital University in 1987, he spent eighteen years teaching instrumental music in central Ohio. In recognition of distinguished contributions, Professor Swearingen was recently accorded the title of professor emeritus from Capital University. School directors, student performers and audiences worldwide have enthusiastically received his numerous contributions for band. With over 600 published works, he is one of the most prolific composers and arrangers of concert and marching band music today. In April 2015, the Ohio State School of Music honored Swearingen with its distinguished Alumnus Award.

The Script Ohio Award is bestowed in recognition of a body of work in support of the OSUMB and its alumni. This year's recipient is Doak Ewing (1967,1969-1972) from Napierville, IL for his longtime efforts to cleanup, preserve and document the films of the OSUMB. Doak is a second-generation Sousaphone player; his Father Doak played Sousaphone (1941-1942, 1945), and Grandfather Paul played trumpet (1912-1913) in the OSUMB. They were the first father and son to have dotted the 'I'; and he was also the first third-generation member of the band. But it's been his association with the band after his student days that really set him apart. His technical expertise and vision to restore the films to their best possible condition and make those available to the TBDBITL Alumni Club membership has been a labor of love. The restoration of the films would be incomplete without the trips to Columbus from his home in Illinois, the countless hours at the OSU Archives, and his interviews with Dr. Paul Droste and others to add insightful documentation of these videos. Plus, he has volunteered for this task to provide others with a history of the band unlike any other in America. Currently he has restored films from 1929 to 1984, including footage of the first Script Ohio in 1936. In addition to the films, Doak has also added vintage audio recordings from the Skull Sessions from 1955 through 1978. Thank you, Doak!

The Elvin Donaldson Award is presented to our "most inspirational" alumni bandmember Doug Behnke (1974-1976) from Delaware. Doug formally became the Alumni Active Band Chairman in 2021 and continues in this role today. Some of his responsibilities include organizing and coordinating all events (concerts, parades, bi-monthly rehearsals, basketball, and ice hockey performances); reviews concert announcer scripts; communicates with 300+ band members and other TBDBITL group leaders in Ohio to promote their activities. He recognizes Directors, Announcers, librarians, and charter bus coordinators during events. He recruited Active Band volunteer "Squad Leaders" as a sounding board for operations and changes. Doug keeps the TBDBITL Board of Governors updated on the schedule and advocates for items needed to support the Active Band (i.e., a new banner, musician masks, bell covers, cymbals with carrying case). He ensures all logistics are covered for each event (parking, shuttles, restroom access, water, staging area for Drum Majors and more). He serves on the Social Media Committee; arranges presentations from our members for the Natl. Assn. of Alumni Band quarterly meetings; he has streamlined the payment process for sponsors of our events; he works with Shelley Graf to coordinate Drum Major performances and adequate space for their twirling; and he works with Librarian Susan Scharenberg to communicate day-of-event weather updates. Thank you, Doug!

The Diamond Ohio Award is given to an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to the TBDBITL Alumni Club: We present this award to Kat Straub (1973) Kat was the OSUMB Student Staff Seamstress in 1973. As an alumna, Kat started "Rehydration" at our Reunion game in 1987, moving tons of buckets of ice and water for the Alumni Band on Reunion day until recently when plastic bottles were available. She assists with rehydration at the alumni band reunion to this day. Kat plays Cymbals at Alumni Active Band concerts, HyperActive Band gigs, and on TBDBITL Alumni tours. Her husband Brian Straub (1970-1971,1973-1974) and daughter Rebekah Straub (1994-1997) are alumni snare drummers. Thank you, Kat!

The Diamond Ohio Award is given to Scott Armstrong of Victory Postcards for their many years of service to TBDBITL. They have provided a reunion memento for our TBDBITL membership; Scott has provided many splendid TBDBITL themed gifts: keychains, magnets, magnetic grocery list pads, notepads, ink pens, water bottles, pull string bags, and many more items; all of exceptional quality. Victory Postcards always generously covers the shipping so that our Club pays only for the gifts and Scott personally delivers the items to us. Thank you, Scott!

The Order of Le Regiment de Sambre et Meuse is given to honor an individual who has, through selfless determination, performed works that have demonstrably benefited the public. This action is both unique to the individual, and without doubt could not have occurred, but for them. The award is an homage to the organization's martial history. The tenets of selflessness, courage, generosity, precision, and esprit de corps that create the soul of TBDBITL are exemplified in the music to our most well-known tradition, Script Ohio. Le Regiment de Sambre et Meuse at its heart is an ode to service in the face of adversity.

This year's recipient is Roger Cichy (1975-78, 1983-1984) from Scituate, RI. Roger was a Squad Leader in 1978, and he was a music major who played saxophone, bass clarinet in the concert band and Eb alto horn in the Marching and Military (now Athletic) Bands. He was a member of Kappa Kappa Psi Eta Chapter at two National conferences, served as Production Assistant on the first Script Ohio Yearbook (Centennial Edition) and while he was a Graduate Assistant, he studied band and jazz arranging with Ed Montgomery and Joseph Levey. Next, he spent seven years as the HS band director in Mars, PA before returning to OSU to become one of our finest Graduate Assistant Directors (1983-1984) - Dr. Paul Droste's last year as director and Dr. Jon Woods' first year. He arranged several pieces for the Military Band and also Pregame and Halftime music for the Marching Band. In addition to spending extra time in the Band Room, one time he repainted the entire rehearsal room in the old Stadium Band Room (for those who recall, this included the very detailed large Scarlet / white / black stripes). He holds BS and MA degrees from OSU. Roger spent nine years as Marching Band Director at Iowa State University. He is now a widely known composer and arranger. He prepared two of Ed Montgomery's pieces for publication. He has been commissioned by over 50 public schools, universities, community bands, professional orchestras, and U.S. Military Bands; many with published recordings. Some of his significant commissions were from the Des Moines Symphony Orchestra, the University of Georgia, and the U.S. Air Force Academy Band. 60 of his works have been published with international distribution. Roger has truly found his niche as a composer in recent years. He has completed the music to 13 film scores on patriotic stories narrated by Gary Sinese, Tom Selleck, Matthew Broderick, Jim Nantz, Liev Scheiber, and others. The most recent film covered Bob Hope and World War II, and was shown on PBS on Memorial Day, 2025. He continues working with the World War Two Foundation as a composer for their film documentaries. A new interest is scoring original music for early silent films with three projects completed. Roger's daughter, Rebecca Cichy Wolf (2011), played in the Athletic Band and the OSUMB. In addition to OSU, she holds two graduate degrees from the University of Alabama where she served as graduate assistant of bands. Congratulations Roger!
